Beautiful Beginnings will be open to visitors on Saturday 4th October between 10:00 and 12:00.

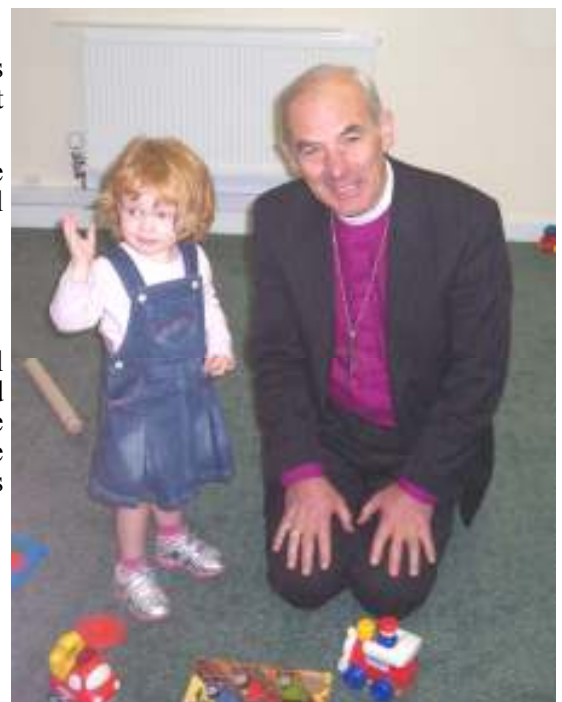
New web site
